Adults and Community Services

About us

Huddleston Way is a supported living project for adults with a learning disability which opened in May 2000. The project offers the opportunity to experience and progress into more independent living, through tenancy with Raglan Housing Association. The project is managed by the Adult Learning Disability Team. We have a complement of trained staff and managers to ensure a high quality service is provided.

A day service is situated next door to the Huddleston Way Supported Living Project office. The day service provides an integrated day service for people working towards a more independent living. It provides a range of educational, social and emotional training.

Our aims

The main objectives of the project are to work with you to develop personal and independent living skills. We carry out assessments to identify the areas in which you require training. This part of the training is to enable you to use the project as a stepping stone to a more independent life in the community.

We aim to link closely with Supported Employment Services to support you to look for opportunities, at the right time to help you to become work ready, explore work placements, volunteering and paid employment where possible.

Services offered by Huddleston Way

The Huddleston Way project consists of 1, 2 and 3 bedroom flats with fully fitted individual kitchens, which cater for 18 people.

The project is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The office at 16 Huddleston Way has a fully fitted training kitchen.

Training

Living Skills Assessments (**LSA**)

- We work closely with you to ensure that we identify the skills you require to live a more independent life and help you to develop them.
- We communicate and listen to what your aspirations are.

Is it for you?

The Huddleston Way project may be for you if you would like to learn to:

- manage your money
- do your own shopping
- do your own cleaning
- use domestic appliances
- use public transport and other areas

Eligibility and access

Huddleston Way provides services for adults with a learning disability from 18 years of age who are eligible for Adult Social Services and are assessed as needing to receive support in staffed accommodation.

If you or anyone you know would like to use the service or find out more about the support available for people with a learning disability and their carers please contact the Adult Learning Disability Team on **01234 276762**. They can offer you advice on eligibility, the referral process and whether you will have to pay any contribution towards the cost of care.

Safeguarding adults
