



Phone and Pay to park



There are many ways to pay for parking:

- Call 01234 860 249
- Text 07786 207 708
- Download the "Phone and Pay" smartphone app (search for "Phone and Pay Parking")

How to use Phone and Pay:

1. Register online or phone 01234 860 249.
2. Quote the location code to book parking.
3. Select how long you wish to park.
4. By using our SMS services you will receive a text message to confirm your parking and when your parking is due to expire.
5. Call back, use our app or text 07786 207 708 to extend your existing parking session.


Customers who have paid by phone will NOT need to display any ticket. Calls are charged at local rates, and will often be included in your monthly minutes. Parking transaction charges apply as follows: 20p for initial parking, 10p for a text reminder, 10p for extending parking (where permitted), 10p for confirmation text.
