1.	SW welcomed everyone to the meeting and the minutes of the 10 th April 2014 were discussed and agreed.	
2.	<p>Service User News and Views:</p> <p>Mrs Reynolds asked what the meetings attitude is to more service users attending? SW explained that this is a service user led partnership board but the reality is that service users change, there is a lack of approachability and it is not at this time user friendly. WD advised that he feels that word is now starting to get out about this meeting.</p> <p>Mrs Reynolds advised that she felt the Pohwer office were not helpful with finding out information about these meetings.</p> <p>SW is conscious that this is not a user friendly and is open to suggestions on this board going forward. WD to promote at the Older People's Partnership Board.</p> <p>PR advised that SEPT hold a quarterly Stakeholders Board Meeting, the last one there were 60 in attendance and 35 – 40 of which were service users. Mrs Reynolds advised that people are daunted by attending these meetings. SW agreed that these meetings could be merged but he would like the views of those directly involved.</p> <p>Mrs Reynolds expressed her concern that she had been involved in the day services review but had never seen the report. SW was under the impression that all who had been involved in this review had been written to about the consultation. The report concluded that there was the need for another report and that the current services in place were meeting the needs. SW to check on the progress of this letter.</p> <p>SW is not convinced by the effectiveness of this board and asked for ideas on how we can make it more successful.</p> <p>JT advised that the Physical Disabilities Partnership Board experiences the same issues with trying to get service users to attend. JT said that she feels it is nice to know that there is a group to go to like this one where your voice can be heard.</p> <p>Steve suggested that after every meeting an A3 poster with highlights from the meeting could be printed and put up in day centres etc.</p> <p>Randeep suggested quarterly outcomes.</p> <p>Mr Reynolds asked about the CCG re-commissioning of mental health services, if BBC are fully engaged and will there be different providers for</p>	SW

	<p>different services? SW confirmed that BBC are fully engaged with the process and does not believe that the CCG are actively seeking four separate providers. BBC is a significant part of the CCG process and any change affecting service users has to be agreed by members.</p> <p>Value based commissioning, a group of service users are working on the contract specification. SP to send the advert to GH to circulate.</p> <p>PR explained that existing front line staff will remain, the services will be the same, it will just be run by a different organisation.</p>	SP/GH
3.	<p>IMH Peer Support: (Attached) Public Health will be taking on some of the services.</p>	
4.	<p>Hate Crime: (Handout) It is Hate Crime Awareness Week this week and the Police are promoting to raise awareness for people with disabilities, mental health, travellers etc. The Police need to know about name calling, abuse etc. SP will ask someone to attend the next meeting to promote this.</p> <p>Randeep will ask John Cain to contact SP re: promoting this to GP Surgeries, Patient Participation Group etc</p>	RK
5.	<p>Asian and Arabic Women's Support Group: (Attached) Presentation by Shaila Bibi, Delivered by Mind, funded by BBC, started delivering in 2013.</p> <p>Mental Health First Aid training was very successful in the communities.</p> <p>All agreed that this is a really good project.</p> <p>The 2nd biggest group in BBC is Italian and Eastern Europeans.</p>	
6.	<p>Housing: Lisa Sparks introduced herself and the team she is from who are the Supported Housing Team. The commission Holman House, Aldwyck Housing Association, BPHA, Warrick Avenue and Angel View. The team are currently looking into how to change approach and on how to deliver services.</p>	
7.	<p>AOB: Randeep advised that Public Health work with the CCG and BBC, wider community, school, organisations etc. The idea is to have a joint CCG and BBC Wellbeing Strategy on what and how. Where does this sit, within public health? There is no additional money so will have to be within existing services. SW is possible for this to be brought to this meeting as a standing agenda item.
