JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: Preschool 1.1 Practitioner/ ASC Practitioner

Responsible to: Pre-school leader/Manager/ Chair of management committee

Purpose of the job: To provide one-to-one support for a child with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. To be part of the staff team to provide a safe, and stimulating environment that supports the high-quality education and care provided for Pre-School children, and school-aged children during After-School Hours; to fulfil legal and statutory requirements; to follow and adhere to Pre-School policies.

Main Duties:

- 1. To provide 1.1 to a child with SEND.
- 2. To deliver and adhere to the child's individual educational plan (IEP) and deliver interventions as stated within the IEP.
- 3. To plan stimulating activities that interest and supports the child's learning and development.
- 4. To work with the Management Team, the child's family and external professionals to ensure the individual needs of the child are beingmet.
- 5. To work with Multi-Agencies where appropriate.
- 6. To ensure the Pre-School is a safe environment for children, that equipment is safe, standards of hygiene are high, safety procedures are implemented at all times and fire drills are practised regularly.
- 7. To show a good understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and how to differentiate activities to meet the needs of the child/ren.
- 8. To promote and provide an inclusive environment.
- 9. To advise the Management team of any concerns, accidents/incidents
- 10. To assist in the preparation and cleaning up of activities
- 11. To record and observe the child's learning and development through Tapestry.
- 12. To encourage positive behaviour by presenting yourself as a good role model
- 13. To adhere to the group's policies and procedures
- 14. To attend meetings and appropriate training courses
- 15. To ensure confidentiality at all times.
- 16. To liaise closely with parents/carers, informing them about the preschool and its curriculum, exchanging information about children's progress and supporting families where appropriate.
- 17. To have a sound understanding of children's developmental requirements
- 18. To attend in-service training and meetings as required.
- 19. To provide a high quality of care to children aged 2-12 years during After-School Club.
