

PUBLIC NOTICE

BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL PROPOSES TO INTRODUCE 'NO WAITING AT ANY TIME' (DOUBLE YELLOW LINES) RESTRICTIONS ON VARIOUS ROADS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF WILLINGTON

Reason for Proposal: The proposal is considered necessary to address concerns of inconsiderate parking at a road junction in the village of Willington. The proposal is at the request of Willington Parish Council.

Effect of Order:

1. To introduce 'no waiting at any time' (double yellow lines) restrictions on the following lengths of road in the village of Willington:

A	Chapel Lane
(i)	On both sides of the road extending a distance approximately 25 metres in a north easterly direction from its junction with Church Road / Station Road
B	Church Road
(i)	On its northern kerb extending a distance approximately 26 metres in a westerly direction and on its southern kerb extending a distance approximately 24 metres in a westerly direction from its junction with Chapel Lane
C	Station Road
(i)	On its northern kerb extending a distance approximately 21 metres in an easterly direction and on its southern kerb extending a distance approximately 19 metres in an easterly direction from its junction with Chapel Lane

BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL
(VARIOUS ROADS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF WILLINGTON, BEDFORD)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2018

Bedford Borough Council (“the Council”) in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“The Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Bedfordshire Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following order:-

This order shall come into operation on the *** 2018 and may be cited as “Bedford Borough Council (Various roads within the village of Willington, Bedford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2018

1. Save as provided in Articles 2, 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order at any time.
2. (i) Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to within the Schedule to this Order so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or in the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said lengths of road of any sewer or main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as described in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (c) the vehicle to be loaded or unloaded while it is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture between such premises and its depository;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it is in the service of employed by a universal service provider (as defined in Section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000), to be used for the purpose of delivering and/or collecting postal packets (as defined in Section 125(1) of the Postal Services Act 2000);
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance, special forces or police purposes;

- (f) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road to be used of a Local Authority in pursuance of Statutory Powers or duties;
- (g) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;

(ii) Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in the Schedule for so long as it may be necessary for enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

3. Nothing in Article 1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which lawfully displays in the relevant position a disabled person's parking badge and disc (on which the driver of the vehicle has marked the time at which the waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to in the Schedule.

4. (i) For the purposes of Article 3 "disabled persons badge" and "parking disc" have the same meanings as in "The Local Authorities" Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000"

(ii) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front nearside of the vehicle and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

(iii) Except where otherwise stated and referenced in this Order to a number or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
