



Your hard work with families has led to 920 successful outcomes. Your March 2020 position was higher than the national average. We would

## Graph showing successful outcomes achieved across the 5 year programme (2015-2020) against national average




Total PbR claims = 920 | Significant and Sustained Progress claims = 907 | Continuous Employment claims = 13

## 2020/21 allocations

You have signed up to deliver an additional year of the Troubled Families programme. As per the revised funding statement issued on 27th March 2020, your attachment target for 2020/21 is 92 families and you have been allocated funding to achieve successful outcomes with 154 families. In the next 12 months you'll be focussed on the families you're already working with that have not yet achieved a successful outcome (907 families)
